About the installation

Biddy Mason's story is one of triumph. I call this installation Choreography of Triumph as the wire figures affixed to the canvas pages dance in celebration of her life, her legacy, and her victory. My current series of wire works evolved from a piece called Choreography of Thought, a work inspired by Dogon ways of knowing. Choreography is a persistent theme in these works as dancing figures imbue spirit, animating and bringing vitality to my process of making. The figures are affixed to four hinged canvases with a textured ground and palm tree silhouettes; iconic references to Southern California, where Biddy made her mark. I see these silhouettes against a pinkish glow in the early morning skies as I gaze southeast from my dining room window. A palm leaf sheath serves as a shield for the freedom staff, made of bamboo, that bears a simple message written in Adinkra alphabet: *Resist - Defend*. These are words from Ghana's national anthem: "Bold to defend ... resist oppressors' rule with all our will and might for evermore."

Biddy Mason's portrait is flanked by cowrie shells and bottled aventurine crystals. Cowrie shells represent currency and green aventurine is a stone of prosperity. It is said to provide strength, confidence, courage, and happiness. It is also a comforter and has healing properties. These qualities were demonstrated throughout Biddy Mason's life.

The Throne is to honor her place within the activation of the Transformative Arts creative space and is placed next to the freedom staff. They emanate the power, majesty, and respect of her presence. Seashells along with remnants of a baobab fruit that I brought back from a journey to the African continent, are reminders of our connection to Africa. The chinaware and other small objects relate to personal rituals that honor the generations of women before me as well as those who follow.

The painting of a rose, called Jessie Mae, was done by my youngest daughter Erin who was inspired by her grandmother Jessie Mae (my mother), whose flourishing gardens, abundant with fruit trees, vegetables, and flowers, helped to cultivate her love of nature. I was motivated to honor her memory in the space of Biddy's Garden.
